The seat of Orange County, Florida, Orlando boasts a population of approximately 228,000 – making it the sixth largest city in Florida. Easily accessible via Interstate 4 and the Florida Turnpike, Orlando is also home to the Orlando International Airport – the 10th busiest airport in the United States and the 20th busiest in the world.

In addition to its world-class theme parks, Orlando is home to a variety of other popular attractions such as fun parks, sightseeing tours, science center, historical museums, zoos, gardens and much more. Unique attractions in the Orlando area include Gatorland, "The Alligator Capital of the World;" Holy Land Experience, "a living, biblical history museum;" WonderWorks, "Orlando's only upside-down attraction"; and Ripley's Believe It Or Not!, an Orlando "Odditorium."

Orlando, Florida, also offers plenty of shopping, dining and nightlife opportunities. Enjoy dining, shopping or partying the night away at Universal CityWalk®, a lively entertainment complex that features a wide variety of nightlife such as CityWalk's Rising Star, Red Coconut Club, Pat O' Brien's, Bob Marley – A Tribute to Freedom, Latin Quarter, the groove and Jimmy Buffett's Margaritaville. Stroll through 120-acre Downtown Disney, which boasts dozens of specialty shops, as well as attractions, themed restaurants and nightlife. Downtown Disney highlights include the new Characters in Flight balloon experience, Cirque du Soleil La Nouba, DisneyQuest Indoor Interactive Theme Park and the AMC Pleasure Island 24 Theatres Complex. For family-friendly dining at Downtown Disney, choose from a variety of options such as Wolfgang Puck Café, Portobello, Planet Hollywood, Fulton's Crab House, T-Rex Café, Bongos Cuban Café, Cap'n Jack's Restaurant, House of Blues, Raglan Road Irish Pub & Restaurant and Rainforest Café, among others. Shoppers will have a field day at World of Disney, "The Largest Disney Character Shop on Earth!"



Getting To And Around Orlando

Florida's busiest airport, the Orlando International Airport, is centrally located and easily accessible to all Orlando area theme parks, attractions and entertainment complexes, as well as downtown Orlando, the Space Coast, deep-water ports and world-famous beaches. Upon arrival at the Orlando International Airport, the trip from your gate to the main terminal aboard an enclosed shuttle with large windows is an experience that gives you an incredible preview of Florida's unique environment. The Orlando

International Airport is bright, attractive and easy to navigate, and offers a variety of restaurants and specialty stores. For more information about the Orlando International Airport, call 407-825-2001.

LYNX is the Orlando area's public transportation system that offers stops at area attractions and hotels. Bus fare is \$2 for adults and \$1 for students with a valid ID and seniors. Children ages 6 and under ride free. LYNX buses depart every 30 minutes from Orlando International Airport to downtown Orlando and International

Drive between the hours of 5:30 AM and 11:30 PM (less frequently on Sundays and holidays). For more information about LYNX, call 407-841-2279.

If you are planning to stay on International Drive, take advantage of daily I-RIDE Trolley rides from 8 AM to 10:30 PM. Trolley fare is \$1.25 (\$.25 for seniors and free for children ages 12 and under with a paying adult). For more information about the I-RIDE Trolley, call 407-248-9590.

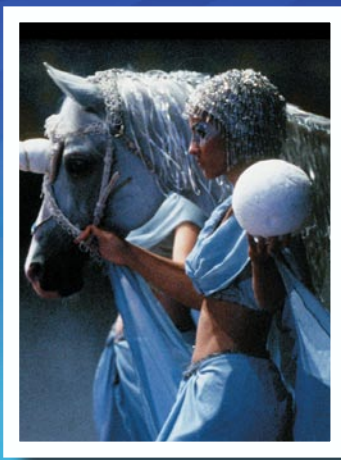

Orlando Dining

A multitude of family-friendly restaurants can be found in the Orlando area, whether you are seeking American cuisine or just about any international cuisine such as African, Asian, Cajun, French, Indian, Italian, Middle Eastern, Mexican or Spanish. Seafood, steak and barbecue restaurants are also in abundance throughout the area such as Westgate Smokehouse Grill at Westgate Lakes Resort & Spa, McCormick's & Schmick's at The Mall at Millenia and Shula's Steakhouse at the Walt Disney World Dolphin. For excellent "themed" dining, check out Downtown Disney, which features outstanding places to eat such as T-Rex Café, Raglan Road Irish Pub & Restaurant, Rainforest Café, Wolfgang Puck Café, Planet Hollywood, House of Blues and Bongos Cuban Café. Universal CityWalk® at Universal Orlando also boasts a variety of themed restaurants such as Jimmy Buffett's Margaritaville, NBA Café, NASCAR Sports Grille, Bubba Gump Shrimp Co., Emeril's Restaurant Orlando, Bob Marley – A Tribute to Freedom, Pat O'Brien's and Hard Rock Café.

Several live entertainment venues can be found at Disney World® Resort such as Disney's Spirit of Aloha Polynesian Luau at Disney's Polynesian Resort and Hoop-Dee-Do Musical Revue at Fort Wilderness Resort. The critically acclaimed Cirque du Soleil show, La Nouba, at Downtown Disney is a groundbreaking spectacle that combines theatrical effects, daring acrobatics, dance, circus acts, comedy and live music. Universal Orlando® Resort features the internationally renowned Blue Man Group in the Sharp AQUOS Theatre and the Wantilan Luau at Loews Royal Pacific Resort. SeaWorld® Orlando's Makihiki Luau – a lively celebration of the music, dance and delicious cuisine of the Pacific islands – takes place at 6:30 PM nightly at the SeaWorld Waterfront's Seafire Inn.

Orlando Shopping

Orlando is truly a shopper's paradise with its upscale malls, factory outlet stores and flea markets, as well as immensely popular shopping, dining and entertainment districts such as Downtown Disney and Universal CityWalk®. Trendy and upscale, The Mall at Millenia features anchor retailers Macy's, Bloomingdale's and Neiman Marcus, as well as an eclectic collection of more than 200 specialty stores. The largest mall in Central Florida, Florida Mall boasts more than 270 specialty stores, including Dillard's, JCPenney, Burdines, Sears, Nordstrom, Saks Fifth Avenue, Pottery Barn and J. Crew. Festival Bay Mall at International Drive, which was built in 2003 and features 900,000 square feet of retail space, boasts a variety of eclectic specialty shops, restaurants, attractions and a movie theater. Other area malls include the 1.3-million-square-foot Altamonte Mall, one of the largest regional malls in Florida; the Orlando Fashion Square, which lies just East of downtown Orlando; and Seminole Town Center, which is located at I-4 and State Road 46.

For savings up to 25 to 65 percent off retail prices, check out Orlando Premium Outlets, which is home to more than 110 stores, as well as a food court. The Lake Buena Vista Factory Stores – located just over 1 mile from the main entrance to Walt Disney World® Resort, consists of more than 40 factory outlet stores that provide savings up to 75 percent off retail prices. World-famous International Drive features dozens of unique specialty shops and factory outlet stores such as Prime Outlets Orlando, as well as the Pointe*Orlando shopping, dining and entertainment complex, which is home to the state-of-the-art Regal Cinemas Pointe





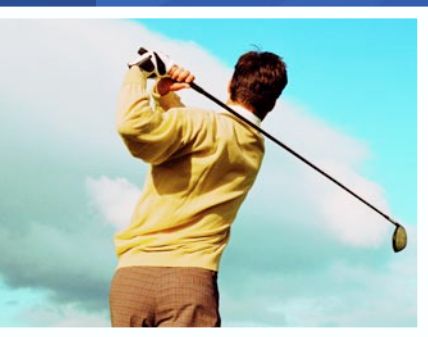

Orlando. A bustling shopping and entertainment complex in Kissimmee, Old Town boasts 75 specialty shops, eight restaurants and 18 thrilling amusement park rides. Area flea markets include International Drive Flea Market in Orlando and Osceola Flea & Farmers Market in Kissimmee.

Orlando Golf

The abundance of championship golf courses throughout Central Florida – along with beautiful weather year round, world-class theme parks, a variety of accommodation choices, eclectic dining and nonstop nightlife – combine for the ultimate golf getaway. With dozens of championship golf courses in and around the Orlando area, a round of golf is available for every skill level and budget.



Walt Disney World® Resort itself boasts five championship golf courses: Osprey Ridge, Palm, Magnolia, Eagle Pines and Lake Buena Vista. Designed by legendary architect Tom Fazio, Osprey Ridge is arguably the most difficult course at Disney World. The Palm course has been rated 4 stars by *Golf Digest*. The Magnolia course is known for the abundance of beautiful Magnolias that line the fairways. Eagle Pines is a par-72, 18-hole course designed by Pete Dye. Opened in 1971, the par-72 Lake Buena Vista course features 6,819 yards of golf. Disney World also offers the nine-hole, par-36 Oak Trail golf course.

Plenty of championship-caliber golf courses lie just minutes from Walt Disney World Resort. For instance, the award-winning MetroWest Golf Club was designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr. and offers a wide range of challenges, including numerous bunkers and plentiful water hazards, as well as expansive fairways. Celebration Golf Club, which lies just 5 minutes from Disney World, was also designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr., along with his son, Robert Trent Jones Jr. ChampionsGate Golf Resort features 36 holes of championship golf and is also home to the world-renowned David Leadbetter Golf Academy. Designed by Ron Garl and Howard Swan, the par-73 Eagle Creek Golf Club boasts five par 5 holes. Two area courses, Grand Cypress Golf Club and The Golden Bear Club at Keene's Pointe, were both designed by "The Golden Bear" himself, Jack Nicklaus. The award-winning Grand Cypress Golf Club features three nine-hole courses, as well as the 18-hole New Course. It is also home to the Grand Cypress Academy of Golf.

Orlando also hosts several golf tournaments on the PGA tour, including the Arnold Palmer Invitational at Arnold Palmer's Bay Hill Club & Lodge in March and the Children's Miracle Network Classic at Walt Disney World Resort's Palm and Magnolia courses in mid-October. Both of these popular tournaments draw some of the top professional golfers in the world such as Tiger Woods, Vijay Singh and Phil Mickelson.

- Use sunscreen, wear a hat and drink plenty of water when you're outdoors.
- Wear comfortable clothes and shoes, especially if you're visiting a theme park.
- Take a break or do something indoors (visit a shopping mall) during the hottest part of the day.
- Keep an eye out for coupon books and discounts for theme parks, attractions, restaurants, etc.
- If you are visiting a theme park with young children, don't forget to bring along a backpack with some snacks and juice boxes.
- Whenever you leave a theme park, make sure to get your hand stamped. Then after you rest awhile and enjoy a cheaper dinner off site, you can head back to the park after the crowds have thinned out.
- Establish a budget for souvenirs and stick to your budget.
- Arrive at the theme parks early – at least a half hour before it officially opens – so you can get a jump on the crowds.
- Use theme park maps and tip boards to develop a plan in order to visit as many attractions as possible.
- Don't follow the crowd – Many people will go to the right and move clockwise throughout the theme park, so try going left and moving counterclockwise.
- Avoid driving to or from the theme parks on Interstate 4 during rush hour, which usually runs from 7 to 9 AM and 4 to 7 PM on weekdays.
- If you choose to eat at the theme parks, try to make lunch your big meal of the day when prices are considerably lower than for dinner.
- Purchase such necessities as film and sunscreen before you arrive at the theme parks, since prices at the parks are more expensive for such items.
- If you love a parade, stake out your spot early since they usually draw huge crowds. Also, by picking a spot toward the beginning of the parade, you will get a jump on everyone else. You will have finished the parade and made it to the most popular rides while most of the crowd is still watching the parade.
